With asset growth of \$29.3 million, the successful launch of our new website, and a thorough remodel of our branch in Barrington, we're pleased to report that 2017 was another strong year for Federal Savings Bank—one marked by significant change for the organization and its people.

Change can be a good thing. When the Dover Co-Operative Savings Fund and Loan Association first opened in 1890, it changed the landscape of banking, giving local people a strong new option for building their nest egg and financing their dreams. 
